

Special Situations for Transfer Credit

- Calculation of the EGPA must be based on at least 6 credit hours taken at OSU.
- If a student has credit for all EGPA classes but has taken fewer than 6 credit hours of them at OSU then:
 - The student may repeat EGPA classes for which they have transfer credit if permitted by the offering unit and OSU policy, for letter grade at OSU.
 - Sophomore level required core ECE classes that do not require admission to major may be included in the EGPA calculation.
 - All such classes completed at end of the semester of application to major will be included in the calculation.
 - The sum of credit hours of EGPA classes taken at OSU and of these ECE classes must be 6 or greater.
 - The best grade policy also applies if any of these ECE classes have been repeated.
 - If a student has transfer credit for so many of the sophomore level required core ECE classes that the 6 credit hour minimum for the EGPA is still not reached then he or she may be given special permission to take subsequent ECE classes for which the course prerequisites are met prior to formal admission to major. CPHR must be 2.0 or better to receive this permission.
 - All such classes completed at end of the semester of application to major will be included in the calculation.
 - The sum of credit hours of EGPA classes taken at OSU and of the ECE classes must be 6 or greater.
 - The best grade policy also applies if any of these ECE classes have been repeated.
 - If a student does not achieve sufficiently high EGPA and CPHR to earn admission to major after completing these classes he or she will not be given special permission to take additional ECE classes. If the student still wishes to pursue admission to the ECE major he or she will need to repeat EPGA classes, sophomore level required core ECE classes that do not require admission to major, or the same ECE classes for which special permission was previously granted.
